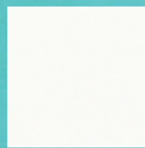
"When you have small closets, functionality and customization are vital," says Meryl. "While it's important to utilize every available inch of wall space, you still need to create a system that works best for your specific needs."

So, when Kick Kennedy wanted to transform the small closets in her Manhattan apartment, she turned to Meryl and ClosetMaid for help.

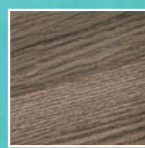
## Shoe Storage Made Simple

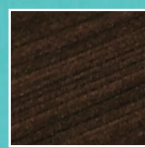
